What personal information will be collected about your child?

 Their demographic information such as race/ethnicity, age, free or reduced-price meal eligibility, special education status, school, grade, English Language Learner status, Title I status, behavior data, and Student State ID which will be used by the Minnesota Department of Education to link with other student data like school attendance and test scores.

Who can see the personal information that is collected?

Access to private information about your child will be strictly limited and protected. Some of the people who may have access include:

- Auditors or those who have a legal right to review the work of this program
- Cityspan Technologies, Inc. staff who support this initiative by providing a custom data warehouse system
- Minnesota Department of Education staff who use the information to understand how
 programs are working and write reports: private (identifiable) information about you or your
 child will never-appear in published reports
- Others may see information if it is required by law (such as a court order or warrant) to release it.

What are your rights related to the data collected for 21st CCLC?

- Your child is still able to participate in programming even if you decide not to allow you child's data to be included.
- You have the right to obtain a copy of the information that is collected and kept about your child.
- You have the right to correct any mistakes in the information about your child.
- If you think you or your child's privacy rights have been violated, you have the right to file a complaint with the Minnesota Department of Education:
